

How to Buy The Right Piano For you?

Beginner or 'Learning for Fun'

Digital or a budget acoustic piano

DIGITAL

Kawai KDP or CN series, Yamaha Arius series, budget KORG and Roland instruments

Find people selling their preloved pianos or even giving acoustic pianos away at absolutely no charge, you would only need to pay for the transportation

Both options will allow the player to get used to: a fully-sized 88 keys keyboard, play with dynamics (manipulate the loudness and quietness of the sound)

ACOUSTIC

Any local piano maker (.e.g Chappell, Kemble in the UK) used or budget refurbished instrument

Intermediate Player 'Taking It More Seriously'

Digital and acoustic pianos would be a great option. However, at this stage you might want to consider investing into something of a better standard

DIGITAL

Yamaha Hybrid, Yamaha Clavinova, Kawai Hybrid, Kawai Digital CS or CA series etc

If choosing a digital piano then, from an upper range

ACOUSTIC

Yamaha b series, Kawai K15E series, Feurich Premiere 115 etc

Upper range of Yamaha and Kawai acoustic uprights or grand, C. Bechstein, Bosendorfer, Petrof, Grotrian Steinweg, Steinway and Fazioli
